In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Sabattus, in said county, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Sabattus Community Room at 190 Middle Road in said Town, on Thursday May 19, 2015, at 6:00 o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator by written ballot to preside at said meeting.

Action Taken on Article 1: Mark Duquette nominated Normand LaPlante as moderator of the Town Meeting. André Marquis seconded the nomination. Ballots were casts. Normand LaPlante is elected moderator and sworn in by Judy Fournier, Deputy Town Clerk.

The moderator requested a vote to allow the following non-residents to speak: Anthony Ward, Town Manager, Senator Garrett Mason, Representative Steve Wood, Gary Baillargeon, Chief of Police, Mark Veilleux, Fire Chief, Jerry Sabins, Transfer Station Manager and Paul Morin, Sabattus Water District. Motion made by André Marquis and seconded by Jeff Baril to allow non-residents to speak. Vote Taken. It Passes.
