

MINUTES FOR TOWN MEETING

TOWN OF SABATTUS

May 18, 2017

AND ACTIONS TAKEN ON WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Town Clerk, Suzanne Adams opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. and read the following:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Sabattus, in said county, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Sabattus Community Room at 190 Middle Road in said Town, on Thursday May 18, 2017, at 6:00 o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator by written ballot to preside at said meeting.

Action Taken on Article 1: Mark Duquette nominated Normand LaPlante as moderator of the Town Meeting. Connie Castonguay seconded the nomination. Ballots were casts. Normand LaPlante is elected moderator and sworn in by Suzanne Adams, Town Clerk.

The moderator requested to allow the use of Robert's Rules.

The moderator requested a vote to allow the following non-residents to speak: Suzanne Adams, Town Clerk, Anthony Ward, Town Manager, Gary Baillargeon, Chief of Police, Marc Veilleux, Fire Chief, Jerry Sabins, Transfer Station Manager and State Representative Steve Wood.
